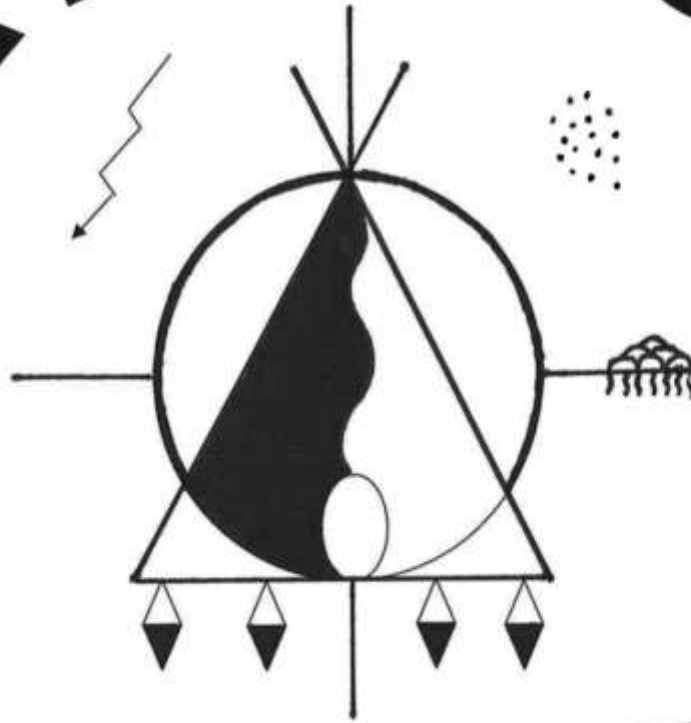

I am including this document so that everyone is very aware of the expectations of riding the bus, there have been ongoing reports of both graffiti and unacceptable behavior on the bus that have been reported to the schools and myself. I would not want parents/guardians and students to not know that guidelines are in place for their safety and wellbeing. I am encouraging parents and guardians to preview the guidelines and advise students of the expectations of riding the bus. (A gentle reminder that riding the bus is a privilege and not a right, and I know this is the first time for many of the students traveling this far per day.)

**Upcoming Events:****Parent Meeting: Thursday November 13<sup>th</sup>. Time: 7pm.**

Please come out to discuss educational concerns: transition, transportation issues with myself and the Chair of the Education Council, Roberta Bear. We will meet at the Whitecap Elementary School, please come out to discuss ideas to ensure the success of our Whitecap Students. Refreshments and snacks will be provided. All parents, guardians are encouraged to attend. We hope to see you there!

**Next Student Meeting (Elementary): Thursday November 20<sup>th</sup> at 4:30-** at the Whitecap Elementary School. There will be a light meal and games. This meeting will be held for Grades 4/5 to 8. # Guidelines for a Safe School Bus Ride

## For Parents, Sitters & Guardians:

- Always make sure that students are at the bus stop before the scheduled departure time. Buses are not allowed to wait past this time.
- Sometimes buses can be delayed by road closures, weather, etc. So, if a child is too young to wait at a bus stop alone, a responsible person should always wait with them - especially in cold or stormy weather.
- If a bus is late, you can call our bus hotline 306-374-4777 to find out where it is. During cold weather go back inside if the bus is more than 10 minutes late from the scheduled time and call the bus hotline number 306-374-4777 to check on the status of your bus.
- After school, always make sure someone is home during drop-off time. Pay extra attention to school early let-out days.
- Keep in mind that families are allowed only one registered pick-up and drop-off address. For flexibility, you are allowed to "borrow" other student's stops if a signed permission note is given to the driver each time the borrowed stop is used.
- Call the school to make any changes in your busing arrangements such as address, sitter, phone number, etc. When the change is processed, your driver will contact you with verification.
- Because our buses operate by departure times, there is no need to contact anyone if a student is not riding for a day. Inform your driver of any long term absences.

## For Students:

- Always be at the bus stop before the departure time.
- Never run towards a school bus, and please don't push or shove as the bus approaches.
- Anytime the bus is moving, please keep your "seat on the seat" and both feet on the floor until the bus comes to a complete stop.
- Always follow your driver's instructions.
- There is no eating on the bus allowed, and please help the driver keep the bus clean.
- The aisles must be kept clear at all times in the event an emergency evacuation becomes necessary.
- Talk to your neighbor only, and respect each other with no yelling, screaming, bullying or bad language.
- Know that you are responsible to the school principal for your behavior while on the bus, and that your driver reports to the school directly about behavior issues.
- If you miss the bus after school, go back inside and tell school staff.
- Large/dangerous objects that may cause injury are not allowed on a school bus.
- If anything happens on a school bus that upsets you, please tell your driver or school staff as soon as possible.

Read on for important updates and reminders regarding Membership  
Information from your Indian Registry Administrator (IRA) – Sheila: 477-0908.

#### NEW PARENTS

Expecting a child soon or already have a newborn?

- ❑ Please call or come and see me as soon as possible after your child is born so we can discuss the eligibility for registration and prepare to fill out forms.
- ❑ Step 1: you will need your child's birth document:
  - a) As your IRA, I may request a "birth extract" from the AANDC on behalf of Members for registration purposes. Therefore, please allow me to put forth this request before you spend the fee to order a birth certificate. [These are usually only available in their system for newborns.]
  - b) If a birth extract is not available as in a) above, you will need to order your child's original birth certificate from *eHealth Saskatchewan* (Vital Stats). See below for more information about eHealth.
- ❑ Step 2: complete an application for registration form and submit the original form (signed by both parents) along with original birth document to me for processing.
- ❑ Step 3: wait for correspondence from AANDC regarding application status. Once the registration is complete, AANDC will send you a letter confirming your child's registration.

#### NEW FORM AND ADDRESS TO ORDER BIRTH CERTIFICATES from eHealth Saskatchewan

- You may pick up a form at the Band Office or print one online from: *[note new website address]*  
<http://www.ehealthsask.ca/vitalstats/Pages/default.aspx>
- You now have the option to order online; you must have a valid credit card to process your order online. If you do not, you will need to submit your order using the manual forms-based process.
- **Note:** please ensure you order the **long form** birth certificate as it states the parent's names and this is an absolute requirement for the 'registration as an Indian' process and it will be too for the new SCIS cards
- The forecasted turnaround time is **5 business days** (fee is \$25)
- **Priority Service** is **5 business days** (costs an extra \$30 for this service)

#### REQUESTS FOR STATUS NUMBERS

- IRA's may not release a member's status number over the telephone; however, the member may come into the office to see the IRA in person, show identification, then the IRA can release the member's or their child(s) status number.
- Alternatively, you may call the IRA with direction to fax you or your child(s) information to a medical office for services that are pending (i.e., doctor, dentist, pharmacy).

#### STATUS CARDS

- 👉 Just a friendly reminder that I do not accommodate walk-in requests for status cards as I have other responsibilities besides IRA duties. Please call me ahead of time if you wish to make an appointment for a status card. Thanks for your cooperation.

#### UPDATE ON SCIS (Secured Certificate of Indian Status) card

- AANDC still does not know when the new SCIS status cards will be rolled-out at the Community level.
- Applications for the new SCIS cards *are* being processed at the AANDC offices in Prince Albert and Regina.
- AANDC is now accepting applications for the new SCIS by mail; please refer to their website for the application form(s) and process: [www.aadnc-aandc.gc.ca](http://www.aadnc-aandc.gc.ca) (search SCIS)

Registered Indians 16 years of age and older need to provide the following: Completed SCIS Adult Application; Original long-form birth certificate; (2) passport style photos; valid I.D.; Guarantor declaration

## **All Medical Taxi Transportation Users:**

### **Two-Day Notice**

- Please be reminded that a two-day (48 hours) notice is required in order to process Medical Taxi Transportation (excluding Saturday & Sunday).

### **Escorts**

- Children (18 years & under) & Elders (with limited mobility) are required to have an escort for the duration of the trip.

### **Cab Sharing & Coordination**

- Be advised that passengers may at times require to share a taxi which means that there will be a wait time between appointments before returning back to Whitecap.

### **Cancellations**

- If you need to cancel your medical taxi, please call the Health Centre two hours before your scheduled pick up.

### **Medical Emergencies**

- If your condition is a medical emergency, call 911;
- If admitted into the Hospital, notify the Health Centre in which case the NIHB Call Centre will process the return taxi trip upon discharge if there are no other means of travel home.

### **Nurse Practitioner**

- Please keep in mind that the local Nurse Practitioner is available (Monday, Tuesday & Thursdays) as another option to seek medical care. Please book an appointment by calling the Health Centre.

A Nurse Practitioner is a registered nurse who works in a Primary Health setting, has additional education and training, writes a national qualifying exam and is licensed by the Saskatchewan Registered Nurses Association as an independent practitioner.

### WHAT CAN A NURSE PRACTITIONER DO?

- Can diagnose and treat common medical illnesses, chronic medical conditions such as diabetes or COPD.
- Can order tests such as laboratory tests, x-rays, and ultrasounds, pre-op appointments.
- Perform common procedures such as removal of moles, excision and drainage of abscesses and suturing of simple wounds (cuts).
- After assessment, prescribe medications (except narcotics)
- Provides education, injury prevention & health promotion.

# Who Can Get a Free Flu Shot?

- ✓ **All Saskatchewan residents 6 months and older are eligible to get a free (publicly funded) seasonal influenza vaccine.**
- ✓ **The vaccine is strongly recommended for individuals at high risk of becoming seriously ill with influenza.**
  - People with chronic health conditions, such as:
    - lung and/or heart disease
    - asthma
    - diabetes mellitus (types 1 and 2)
    - neurological conditions
    - cancer
    - kidney disease
    - children on long term aspirin therapy
  - Adults 65 years of age and older
  - Pregnant women in all trimesters
  - People with severe obesity
  - Residents of a nursing home or other care facility
  - Children from 6 months up to and including 59 months of age (younger than 5 years old)
- ✓ **People who should be immunized to protect those at high risk of getting influenza include:**
  - Healthcare workers and volunteers
  - Household and close contacts of persons who are at risk of getting seriously ill with influenza
  - Household and close contacts of babies younger than 6 months old
  - Members of households expecting babies
  - Individuals providing regular child care to children up to 59 months of age (younger than 5 years old) either in or out of the home
  - People who work with poultry or hogs
  - Health science students (human and animal health)

## NOTES:

- Non-publicly funded influenza vaccines may be available through workplaces or available for private purchase at pharmacies.
- The Ministry of Health does not reimburse the cost of privately-purchased vaccines.

As per your Rental Tenancy Agreement in section 8(b) of your contract states: "Inspect and replace (if necessary) furnace filter on a monthly basis." We have included helpful information for you to help keep costs low for both energy bills and any repair costs that may arise due to a lack of maintenance to the furnace.

## **\*\*Importance of Furnace Filters\*\***

### **Have you ever notice:**

1. You turn your thermostat high to heat your home.
2. You turn on the De-humidistat (Ventilation fan), but still have humidity
3. Your exterior doors and door knobs are freezing up.
4. You notice stale air and poor circulation in your home.

These are some of the results of neglecting to keep your Furnace Filter clean. A dirty filter can affect people with allergies or hypersensitivities, and can lead to higher heating bills, and can also lead to overall furnace failures. When you do not replace or clean your furnace filter regularly then dirt, dust and other debris can build up inside the furnace unit causing serious problems in the long run. Your furnace has to struggle harder to heat your home; you will be paying more in heating bills caused by a dirty furnace filter. When a furnace becomes clogged with dirt and debris, this creates dirty air that will circulate throughout your home, rather than the clean fresh air that you once enjoyed. You and your family will be breathing in all these toxins that could have been sucked out of the air by a clean or new filter. Now may be time to replace furnace filters to restore the clear air in your home.

### **Neglecting your furnace will cause a number of serious problems to arise.**

1. Your furnace may simply break down, typically when you least expect it and no one is around to fix or repair it.
2. Water lines may freeze up causing excessive damage to your home.
3. Furnace heat exchanger may become warped or crack from unbearable heat build-up within your furnace, and causing noxious carbon monoxide fumes to leak into your home.
4. Faulty furnaces have also been known to start fires caused by a dirty filter by not allowing air to circulate properly throughout the furnace and home.

### **Reasons to keep up with your furnace filter maintenance.**

1. You can save yourself a lot of stress, health problems and financial burden simply by buying a \$6.00 furnace filter.
2. This will ensure that air is circulating properly throughout your home and increase the longevity of the furnace.
3. You will be pleased that your family and home is receiving the best air quality possible and
4. You will have lower heating bills.



## How often should a furnace filter be replaced?

It is suggested by furnace manufacturing companies and furnace technicians that filters should be inspected or changed at least once a month during the heating season. This also varies from house to house and filter to filter. The less expensive conventional filters do not require changing as often and can last longer, however they are not the best at blocking small dust particles and other allergens. Also to consider is the living conditions such as, if you have more pets or anyone smokes regularly inside, then the filters need to be changed almost every month. Based on all this, the recommendation is to buy a higher quality filter, look at it monthly and plan to change it every one to three months.

### **\*\*Note from Whitecap Dakota Housing Department\*\***

We recommend changing the furnace filter a minimum of every three months, especially if you live in a home constructed in 1997 or newer. Your home may have a central ventilation fan coupled to your furnace system. When you turn on the ventilation fans in your home, the fan exhausts air from the kitchen and bathrooms while bringing in fresh air to be circulated throughout the house via the furnace fan. This means that air is constantly going through the furnace filter year round requiring the filter to be replaced on a regular basis. Also due to the amount of sand in the community, air that is drawn into the house will tend to plug up the filters a lot faster because of the sand content in the air. If you want to provide your family with clean air and lower humidity in your home, we encourage you to purchase a 4-6 pack of filters each year varying from \$6 to \$50. This will ensure that there are enough filters to last the entire year and also ensure proper furnace operation and endurance, provide clean air, and lower humidity in the home.

## How to choose the right furnace filter for you home?

There are presently hundreds of models to choose from. Do not worry; you only need to understand a few features of a furnace filters that are essential. These features you should look for while making the purchase.

### Types of Furnace Filters

1. **Washable/Reusable Filters** – These are meant for extended use, and with regular cleaning and maintenance serve a very long life. The downside could be nearly impossible to get completely cleaned and adds resistance to the airflow. These are also not very effective in trapping very small particles.
2. **Pleated Filters** – These are modified kind of panel filters that have pleats or fold to increase its surface area. The design change makes it more efficient at trapping dust particles due to increased surface area. However, once the furnace filter starts resisting airflow it begins collecting dust particles and thus should be replaced regularly.
3. **High Efficiency Pleated Filters** – These filters have an additional component of electrostatic charge that is designed to capture extremely small particles and various allergens, which make up 99% of the particulate composition of the air. These should be changed at regular intervals to maintain the air quality, and flow. Refillable furnace filters are also available in this type.

## How to Size your furnace filter?

Locate the size of air filter you need to remove the old filter from the furnace and look at the sides of the filter. A label should be affixed that indicates the actual size for the filter. After you have located the label or printing with the size on it, put back the old filter until you get a clean one to replace it. If you cannot find a size on the filter than just measure the filter incase. If there is no old filter to measure, find the track that the air filter would normally fit into. Measure the inside of the track and check it with the filter size chart to pick the air filter size that will fit your furnace. Choose the actual size filter and pick one that is 1/2" smaller than the both sides you calculated, so the air filter fits in the track. Most standard sized filters are **16"x 25"x 1"**. Ensure the arrows on the filter point towards the furnace unit.

## HISTORIC MONUMENT UNVEILING FOR WHITECAP DAKOTA FIRST NATION AND PRINCE EDWARD

On September 19<sup>th</sup> Whitecap Dakota First Nation and His Royal Highness Prince Edward, Earl of Wessex participated in the monument unveiling as a part of his visit to Saskatchewan. Located by the Farmers Market in Saskatoon, the monument educates Canadians on the participation of the Dakota First Nation involvement during the War of 1812. Chief Bear, Councillor Royal, Councillor Eagle and Senator Littlecrow welcomed Prince Edward at the "Spirit of Alliance" monument site. Representing the multicultural allies who participated in the war, Chief Bear spoke about the importance of this monument:

"Canada was formed on partnerships between First Nations and settlers. The Dakota took the side of the British, fighting against the Americans in the War of 1812. If you go back in time, people think 1867 was when somebody flipped a switch and Canada was born, but there were humble beginnings prior to that."

The monument is a donation from the Whitecap Dakota First Nation and our government and corporate partners to the City of Saskatoon. "We must remember our original veteran soldiers and warriors who together made the ultimate sacrifice and laid the foundation for our beautiful multi-cultural nation" said Chief Bear. "We honour this spirit of alliance through this monument that we have built with our partners".

Following Chief Bear's speech, Prince Edward stated "It's a great privilege to be here and to be standing on the Whitecap Dakota First Nation land and to be able to honour all First Nations who contributed to the 1812 War."

The day was filled with excitement as hundreds gathered around the monument site to witness the Prince and Chief Bear unveil the monument created by artists Adrian Stimson, Ian Grove and J.S. Gauthier. After Prince Edward and dignitaries revealed the monument, "O Canada" was sung in the



Dakota language by the Whitecap Dakota School children. The festivities continued for the Prince as a special performance was held in the Farmers Market by the Buffalo Boys and drumming from the Sioux Valley Drummers.

If you would like to see the monument, it is located by the roundabout at Avenue A and Spadina Crescent. Thank you to everyone who came out to witness this historic day.

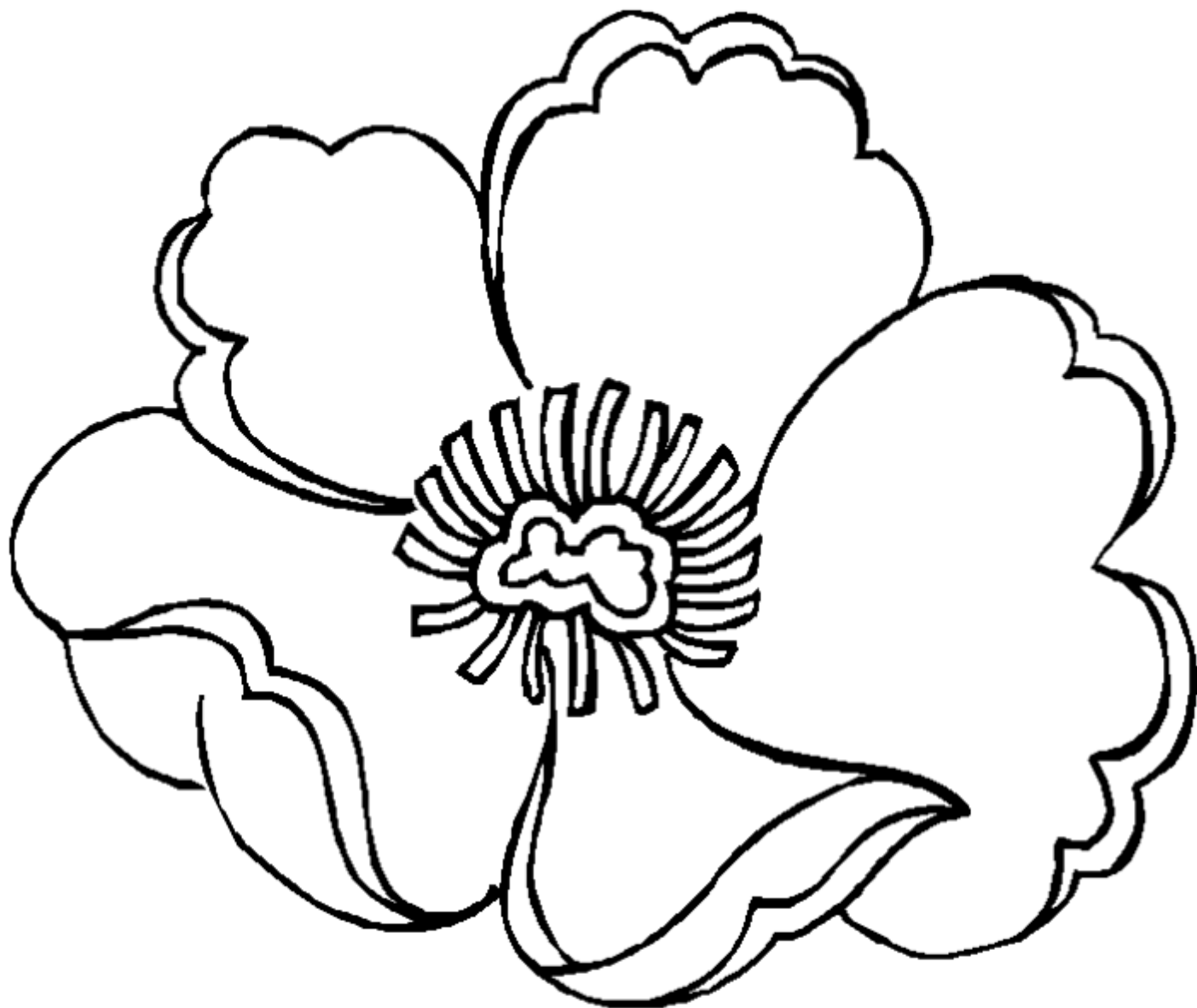

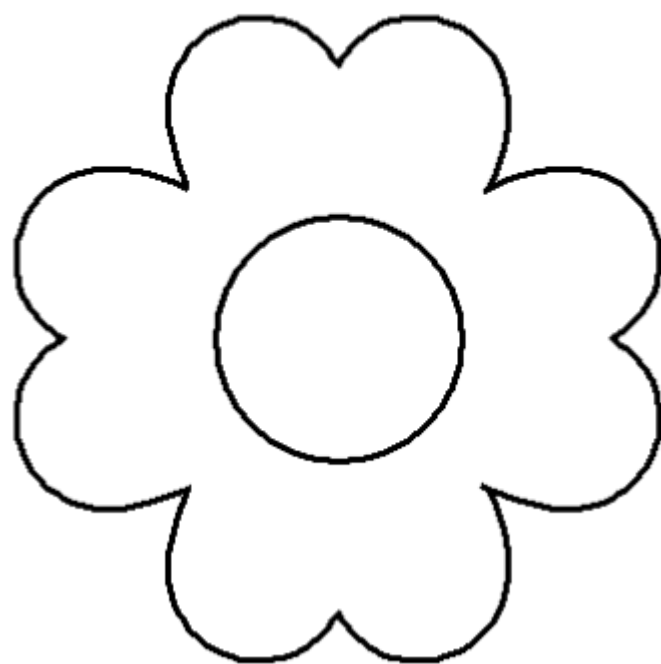

## COMMUNITY CONSULTATIVE GROUP

### CALL FOR APPLICANTS

The Whitecap Dakota First Nation (WDFN) recently signed a Community Tripartite Agreement with Canada and the Province of Saskatchewan. The CTA outlines the obligations of the three parties in order to provide policing services in the Community.

One of the obligations of the WDFN is to establish and maintain a Community Consultative Group (CCG).

The CCG shall:

- Be representative of the Community and should include participants who are Elders, Women and youth (18+ years old);
- Consist of no less than 5 members and no more than 7 members; and
- Meet at least once every 2 months during the term of this Agreement.

The role and responsibilities of the CCG shall be to:

- Identify policing issues and concerns of the WDFN Community and bring them to the attention of the RCMP Member(s) and work with the RCMP Member(s) in seeking solutions to these issues and concerns;
- Work with the RCMP Members(s) to develop the objectives, priorities, goals, strategies, and special projects related to policing and effective crime prevention strategies, identify which by-laws are to be enforced, describe how RCMP Members can participate in or be involved in the Community, and specify the expected frequency and nature of meetings between the RCMP Member(s) and the CCG, and develop a LOE outlining these elements;
- Participate in the periodic evaluation of the police services which will assist the Community and the policing service to address specific Community issues and concerns;
- Identify desirable attributes for the RCMP Member(s) who are to be considered for deployment to the WDFN Community; and
- Complete the RCMP FNCPS Report using the form provided by Canada to the WDFN on or before June 30 of every Fiscal Year covered by this Agreement.
